

Frequently asked questions

What is New Horizons?

New Horizons is Duchenne UK's first conference for the Duchenne muscular dystrophy (DMD) community. It will bring together people personally affected by DMD, and those who are working to help DMD patients and their families. There will be presentations from the UK's leading DMD specialists and researchers on the latest developments in research, treatment and care. It is also a chance to meet other members of the DMD community.

New Horizons 2024

In March 2024, we are delighted to host our inaugural New Horizons conference, which we will hope will become a fixed date in the calendar moving forwards.

What is the date of the event?

Friday 1st - Saturday 2nd March 2024

Where will the event take place?

Holiday Inn London, Bloomsbury, Coram St, London WC1N 1HT

How do I get to the venue?

Do you have a special grant for DMD families?

We are offering a travel grant to DMD families in the UK who live outside of the M25. We are offering £150 per family. The £150 travel grant funds will be issued after the event. We will collect your details at the event. You don't need to send us any receipts.

How will I pay for any registration fees or supplementary costs?

One of the Duchenne UK team will be in touch with an invoice for any costs. This will need to be settled by bank transfer.

Community Dinner and Social - Friday PM

A community friendly dinner will be held on Friday evening.

All conference attendees are invited to attend the dinner.

The supplementary cost for those attending from industry, healthcare and voluntary sectors is £70 per person.

What is included in registration package?

The registration fee includes access to all sessions provided throughout the 1.5-day conference programme (Friday afternoon and all-day Saturday).

Families and caregivers can also attend the Friday evening Community Dinner and Social event.

Those attending from industry, healthcare and voluntary sectors will be asked to pay a supplementary cost to attend dinner.

Are meals included in my registration?

- For those attending the conference on Saturday 1st March, lunch is included
- A Community Dinner and Social will take place on Friday 1st March at 19:30. Families attending the event are invited to attend this at no extra charge
- Those attending from industry, healthcare and voluntary sectors will be asked to pay a supplementary cost to attend the Fright night dinner (see above for more info)

Those attending the DMD Care UK meeting on the morning of Friday 1st March will receive lunch. Coffee and tea will be served throughout the day at the conference.

Please note: lunch is NOT provided for New Horizons attendees on Friday 1st March.

What is the cancellation/refund policy?

We understand that unforeseen circumstances do occur which might prevent you from attending the conference. For those delegates attending at no cost, we do ask that if your plans change and you can no longer attend, you let us know as quickly as possible. The event is oversubscribed, and we want to ensure that we offer as many people the opportunity to attend as possible.

Who is Duchenne UK?

Duchenne UK is a charity that was set up in 2012 by Emily Reuben and Alex Johnson following both of their sons being diagnosed with DMD.

They set up Duchenne UK to tackle some of the big challenges in drug development in their search to accelerate the development of treatments. In 11 years, Duchenne UK has raised more than £20 million and used this money to:

- Fund clinical trials of medicines that are now showing promise for DMD
- Set up <u>DMD Care UK</u>, a national care programme for patients with DMD. The programme is establishing best practice across all the disciplines involved in DMD care, and works to ensure all medical professionals and parents know exactly what treatment children and adults with DMD need.
- Create a <u>DMD medical research hub</u> with hospital sites across the country, which has led to more trials for DMD treatments than ever before.
- Develop innovative technologies, the SMART Suit and Dream Chair, to support the independence of people with DMD.

What is DMD?

DMD is a genetic disease that is typically diagnosed in childhood between the age of three and six. It causes muscle weakness and wasting. It eventually affects all the muscles in the body, including the heart and lungs.

DMD almost always affects boys and can affect any ethnicity.

What causes DMD?

It is caused by a fault, known as a mutation, on the dystrophin gene. Dystrophin is a protein that protects muscles; without it, muscles are easily damaged, and their strength and function is weakened.

Treatment

There is currently no cure for DMD but there are treatments and therapies that can slow down DMD progression and improve quality of life.
